Dear Sisters and Brothers,

On this Feast of the Assumption, which we rarely occurs on a Sunday, we celebrate Mary’s assumption into heaven body and soul. “Finally the Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be the more full conformed to her son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death.” The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son’s Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians:

In giving birth you kept your virginity; in your Dormition you did not leave the world, O Mother of God, but were joined to the Source of Life.

You conceived the living God and, by you prayers, will deliver our souls from death.

LEAD (Leaders for Equality and Action in Dayton) in its Nehemiah Action Assembly this past May was able to attain a Family Pass with the RTA. On Wednesday, September 1, 2010, the Family Pass will be implemented. The program will initially be a pilot program. The price for a one-day family pass will be set at \$8.00. Restrictions would be up to two adults and up to two children between the ages of 5-12 or one adult and up to three children. Monthly progress reports on ridership, revenue, operational details, etc. would be collected to gauge effectiveness of this pilot program. The RTA would reserve the right to cancel the program at any time for reasons such as lost of revenue, etc.
